Improvisation challenge

This year the thirtieth anniversary of our beloved Festival falls. From the early beginning we have been looking for highlighting the name of Bergamo in the world, gaining fame through the quality of our proposals focused in particular on the rediscovery of an ancient and forgotten art like that of the organ improvisation. A decisive artistic and cultural contribution for the spread of this discipline in Italy, which from ever has been noticed in European music panorama. And in fact... This year the 1st International Online Organ Festival (www.io-of.org) based in Munich will kick off at the end of April. It is a film review born in these times complicated by the pandemic, which provides for the transmission of videos of organ events recorded in prestigious locations all over the world, from Beijing to London, from New York to Paris, and among these... Bergamo. A unique opportunity to promote our thirty years of work and our wonderful city.

The tonight original concert, preview of a rich season entitled "Impro & Friends", features two artists who were already young quests of our Festival and are now world reference points for this art. Zuzana Ferjenčíková, teacher at Codarts in Rotterdam, and László Fassang, lecturer at the Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique in Paris, will challenge each other amicably to a duel improvising in turn on the same theme - chosen by the audience - thus creating a unique opportunity of comparison. While starting from the same core, their creativity and their musical experience could lead them to reach even antithetical conclusions: a real improvisation masterclass, full of colors, emotions and, who knows, twists. The concert will be fully filmed by a professional troupe led by a film director. The montage will also include interviews, overviews of the city, and much more, thus telling the whole world the story of our Festival, of how Bergamo lived and overcame the shock of the pandemic, of how today it is preparing to be the Italian capital of Culture 2023 with Brescia.

Zuzana László Ferjenciková Fassang

Organ Improvisation



Zuzana Ferjenčíková is Slovak organist, pianist and composer. *She was educated from early* childhood in alignment with the Russian piano tradition (Olga Ormisova, Jevgenij Irshai). She pursued organ studies at the conservatory in Banská Bystrica and at the universities in Bratislava and Vienna (Milan Hric, J. V. Michalko, Peter Planyavsky). She has been influenced especially by the teaching of and collaboration with her Maître Jean Guillou (Paris). She won numerous prizes in international competitions and in 2004 she was the first woman to be awarded the First Prize at the significant International

Competition in Haarlem in the Netherlands. She has founded the Vienna Franz Liszt Society and serves as its president. Regularly she gives master-classes and takes part in international organ competition juries. Since 2015 she lives in Switzerland and follows an intense concert and recording career. From September 2021 she is appointed professor for organ at Codarts University in Rotterdam. As a performer, her interests lie mainly in the Romantic period (works of Franz Liszt), but also in music of the 20th century, notably the compositions of Iean Guillou and Marcel Dupré. As a composer, she writes concert pieces for organ, piano and various instrumental formations and dedicates berself to transcriptions of piano and orchestral works for organ. Since 2018 she records exclusively for the German Label MDG (Musikhaus Dabringhaus und Grimm). New releases: Guillou Organ works Vol. 1; Liszt Organ

As winner of the world's most prestigious organ competitions and awards, László Fassang is one of the most versatile organists of his generation. The focus of his activities comprises the learning and spreading of classical organ literature. As an improvising artist with exceptional abilities coupled as a keyboard player bis interest spreads from the barpsichord to the fortepiano, and from the piano all the way to the Hammond organ. As well as playing in classical chamber formations be regularly participates in world music and jazz performances. He graduated with distinction from the Liszt Academy of Music and the Paris Conservatoire. Taking a year away from studies, in 2000 be spent a year

Concert Hall. Among his competitive triumphs stand out the 2002 Calgary Gold Medal for improvisation and the interpretation Grand Prix and the audience prize of the 2004 Chartres competition. Between 2004 and 2008 he taught improvisation at the San Sebastian College of Music, followed by an organ teaching position at the Liszt Academy in Budapest, where he also finished bis PbD in 2017. Since 2014 be has been teaching keyboard *improvisation at the Paris* Conservatoire (CNSM) succeeding Philippe Lefebvre. Alongside bis pedagogical activities be is a regular panel member at international organ competitions and performs in Europe, North America and the Far East, besides which his records have appeared in Hungary, Japan, France and Germany. He is the artistic director of the organ concert series at the Palace of Arts in Budapest (Müpa-Budapest). In 2006 his accomplishments were acknowledged with the Liszt Prize and the Prima Prize, while in 2013 he was recognized with the Gramofon Award.
